Welcome to our Last half term of 2025

This half term we will be learning about Arctic animals and celebrations

During our first week back, the children will create firework pictures using a range of mixed media. We will also make our fundraising Christmas cards.

Next, the children will make Remembrance Day craft. We will create a poppy wreath using all of their handprints. On Friday 14th we will join in with 'Children In Need.' The children will decorate biscuits and have a party (Only for children who attend on a Friday).

We will then begin to learn about Arctic animals. Animals including walruses, seals, reindeer and polar bears. We will make reindeer food to sell for fundraising. We will take part in science experiments with ice.

The children will make polar bear biscuits. They will use mathematical language when using ingredients. The children will take part in movement activities; moving like different animals.

Learning intentions for this half term Communication and language:

- Use a wider range of vocabulary. Vocabulary from our Arctic animals' topic and church visit.
- Learn new songs and rhymes.
- Listen to stories and learn new facts.

Personal, social and emotional development

- Express their own preferences and choices.
- Show more confidence in new social situations.
- Building friendships and take part in turn taking games.

Expressive arts and design

- Explore different materials through craft, sensory activities and science experiments.
- Develop their own ideas. Explore different materials and decide how to use them.
- Singing songs and dancing to different types of music.

Understanding the world

- Learning about Christmas around the world.
- Using books and technology to research animals and different cultures.
